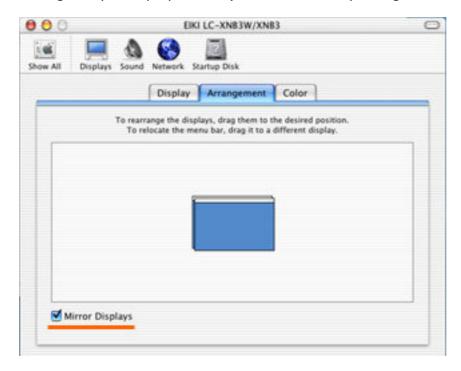
For Mac OS X users

Open your Displays Preferences. Two windows will open.

One window will be on your laptop screen and will look like the one above left. (note the words "Color LCD" at the top of the window. This window controls the settings for your laptop screen.) Do not make any changes to this window.



The second window controls the **projected** image.

(Note: the name of the projector will appear at the top of the window. That tells you what projector you've attached the laptop to.)

Using the trackpad or mouse, move your pointer to the right side of your laptop screen.

Look at the projected image and keep moving the mouse until you see the pointer on the projected image.

Move the pointer to the window. There will be a tab labelled "Arrangement." Click on it.

There will be a check box at the bottom of the "Arrangement" window labelled "Mirror Displays."

Make sure that box is checked.

Both images will flicker and jump for a second as the laptop and the projector resynchronize.

If you are using a 17" Powerbook, set the display (projector) resolution to 1280x960.

If you are using a 15" Powerbook, set the display (projector) resolution to 1024x768.

The screen on your laptop will probably resize itself so there will be black bars on either side of the screen. This is normal. It will go away when you disconnect from the projector and restart your laptop.

The computer should remember these settings and you should not need to reset them each time.
