This study investigates the phenomenon of primary school principal decision-making when evaluating the evidence provided by a *Graduate* teacher moving to the *Proficient* stage of the *Australian Professional Standards for Teachers* (APST) (AITSL, 2011).

Using a Constructivist- Interpretivist paradigm, this study investigates the meaning principal's assign to artefacts of evidence provided by a *graduate* teacher within the Queensland teacher registration process. Through thematic analysis, it is intended that greater insight into how principals make decisions when evaluating evidence provided by a *graduate* teacher seeking to move to the *proficient* standard of the APST will be forthcoming in the areas of school leadership, decision making and teacher standards.
