Evidence of relevant research experience

'Research experience' or possession of a 'relevant research component' must normally be supported by evidence in one of the following forms:

Relevant research component:

- Masters degree by coursework that is equivalent to a Masters Degree from this University
 which includes an independent research component such as a thesis, dissertation or
 research project that received a distinction or above, and
- The research/thesis component of the coursework degree needs to be at least 25% of a twoyear Masters degree or 50% of a one year Masters degree.

Research carried out in groups should at least have been graded individually.

Research experience:

- Scholarly papers involving a substantial contribution as 1st author, appearing in recognised academic journals or in volumes published by recognised academic publishers.
- A portfolio of published creative work together with published critical discussion of some or all of that work, which demonstrates the applicant's leadership in the development of a scholarly approach to creative work as research investigation.
