

A HISTORY OF THE SOUTHERN CROSS UNIVERSITY ART COLLECTION

The aim of this catalogue is to provide a sense of the history of the collection as being intrinsically linked to the history of the institution and the ongoing commitment of all the people who have nursed it along the way because collections don't just happen they need people. Behind every work in the collection there is a story and those stories include a long list of past employees of the institution. It is hoped that this short history of the collection will result in the works that adorn the walls and halls of Southern Cross University being viewed with new insight.

This is a collection that reflects the changing identity of the university over the last 38 years. From the original, Lismore Teachers College – through – the Northern Rivers College of Advance Education – and then the University of New England Northern Rivers – up to – Southern Cross University. The collection is also embossed with changes of location, management and ebbs and flows in commitment to it's ongoing development and care.

The Art Collection was initiated in 1970 / 71 by the principal of The Northern Rivers College of Advanced Education Dr. Raymond Bass.

The first acquisition was a screen print titled 'Fiesta' by **John Coburn** which was purchased through funds that Mr Bass received in the form of a 'gift' from Esso Standard Oil (Australia) Ltd. ¹

In the same year Wagga Wagga Teachers College donated five works to the Art Collection. The suite of works included **B.K Townsend**, Boat shed, **Frank Medworth**, The Pearl Necklace ² **George Lawrence**, Farm Building on South Coast, **Judy Cassab**, Garden and **Kenneth Hood**, The Beach. These five artist belonged to a generation of artists that are all highly respected, their work is represented in most Australian State Galleries. Of these five works three have not be sighted since 1990.

In 1974 Many original records including the original **Works of Art Accessions Register** were lost in the Lismore flood and it is conceivable that a few of the works listed above were also lost or irreparably damaged. ⁴

1978 a group of visual arts staff at The Northern Rivers CAE formed an Aesthetics Committee. This group had an ongoing commitment to building a culturally relevant art collection a mission that was whole wholeheartedly supported by the College principal Dr.F.CWhitebrook and senior visual arts lecturer Mr. Lionel Gailer. Dr. Whitebrook allocated a modest sum of money for the purchase of original work as well as a décor-uplift of public areas of the Lismore campus.

In September 1978 Principle Dr. Whitebrook met ceramicist Shigeo Shiga and was so impressed with his work that he acquired three piece for the collection at a cost of \$300.00. These three works are now worth significantly more than that and are key objects in the ceramic section of the SCU collection. ⁵ There are two works by Shiga in the collection that are almost identical to works by him in The Art Gallery of NSW collection. It is most gratifying to be able to report that through all the moves from place to place over the years non of these ceramic pieces have been damaged or lost.

In October that same year the college purchased five unframed prints through the, Queensland Film and Drama Centre located at Griffith University. The acquisitions included **Colin Lancely**, Vulnerable Forester, **Donald Laycock**, Satire I. **Arthur Boyd**, Two figures and a Dogs Head. **Stephen Killick**, Silent Partners and **Lawrence Daws**, The Moroccan Window. ⁶

Almost every major collection in the country took advantage of this scheme and owns the same suite of prints, which at the time was an issue raised by the aesthetics committee who would have preferred to have acquired something less 'standard'.

However some thirty years later it would be almost impossible to acquire an Arthur Boyd print for \$100.00 so it was a wise enough choice at the time. As Mr Gailer wrote in a memo to Dr. Whitebrook, '...for local consumption they would be outstanding'. 7

Some of these prints have been detrimentally affected by the North Coast climate and periods of abandonment. Silent Partners by Stephen Killick is amongst those works on the original collection register that is now listed as missing, which if not located would be a great loss to the collection.

In 1979 the college purchased a portrait of Lloyd Rees by **Eric Smith.** Smith had a similar but larger portrait of Rees hung in the Archibald Prize the same year which Lloyd Rees thought to be one of the best works in that years exhibition. ⁸ Eric Smith won the Archibald Prize three times.

Other works collected between 1979 and 1983 include artists Milton Moon, Sydney Ball, Idris Murphy, Allan Leach Jones, Peter Rushforth, Ashley Taylor: Studio, Coleen Robinson: Two Soft Pots, Lindsay Broomhead, Leaf Effect, Peter Steggle, River Barge, Lindy Kennedy, screen print Genre 4.30. and three small paintings by Ken Delzoppo.

During this time there was no formal mechanism through which the college collected works nor a formal collection management plan. It all very much depended on the ebb and flow of personal convictions and of course available finances. The most significant of these acquisition were the painting by Idris Murphy and ceramic vessel by Peter Rushforth. Six of these works are currently listed as missing having not been sighted since about 1990.

From about 1985 the management of the collection and a commitment to it's ongoing development appears to have wavered. There was no longer an aesthetics committee or any particular person or area responsible for the collection. The New campus was underway and the collection straddled the two sites. In 1989 all work still on the Keen street campus was moved to the Military Road campus. ⁹

In 1990 the first valuation of the collection was completed by Joe Eisenberg from Armidale Regional Art Gallery. Shortly after this the management of the University Art Collection was offered to the Dean of the School of Contemporary Arts on the basis of there being some perceived expertise in the area! There was also a request that the conservation recommendations noted in the recent valuation be attended to. However this request faltered as no budget or assigned personnel came with it. ¹⁰

From 1990 – 1993 The University Art Gallery (known at the time as Access Contemporary Art Space) was funded through Norsearch. The VC Rod Treyvaud assigned a portion of the gallery budget specifically to the purchase of works of art from SCU visual arts students. These acquisitions formed the core of the Alumni collection.

In 1992 / 93 the School of Arts also funded the Southern Cross University North Coast National Art Award that was held in conjunction with the North Coast National Agricultural show in Lismore. This provided an opportunity to purchase works by artists of the Northern Rivers region including James Guppy, John Smith, and Michael Taylor, all of whom have national exhibition profiles. Michael Taylor is an iconic figure within the regions art community both because of his commitment to arts education and as a practicing artist.

During this same period the SCU Student Union ran an annual student acquisitive art prize. When the union was dismantled some of the acquired work was transferred from the union to the SCU collection.

Between 1994 & 1995 a small budget was afforded the University Art Gallery to catalogue the collection in an appropriate manner. A considerable amount of work was done on formally cataloguing the collection. A partial map of where all the work was located on campus was started and a draft collection policy written. Unfortunately due to the lack of ongoing funding this job was not completed and with the parallel demise of the gallery the collection was orphaned again until 2004.

Between 1994 and 2004 a number of works found their way into the collection, significant amongst these are Janet Laurence, Tim Johnson, Joseph Jurra Tjapaltjarri and Graham Fransella. These works added considerable value to the collection, in particular Janet Laurence's work Periodic Table Works which was included in the touring exhibition 1999 – 2000 titled 'Cinderella's Gems and the Intellectual Mission'. This exhibition was developed by Museums and Collections NSW and comprised of outstanding works from ten universities in NSW and ACT. Laurences work was also used on the front cover of the accompanying catalogue.

In 1998 a memorandum was sent out from Mr. K. Fenton saying that the internal auditor had been unable to locate the most recent Works of Art Register, reportedly last seen in 1994. A request to once again establish a reliable register of the work in the collection, which at this time was estimated to include around 107 works from a diverse range of artists, was issued. A request for financial support to undertake this ongoing management task does not appear to have been forthcoming.

From approximately 1999 - 2004 The University Art Gallery and the management of the collection to all intents and purposes ceased to exist. The collection was moved around campus, mostly by properties. There was no mechanism in place to monitor these movements and many works went missing and or were damaged. In approx 2001 the R Block foyer that had been the University Gallery was needed for other uses and the collection stock room was moved to an empty office in V Block, a number of works on paper went missing in this process.

In 2004 a part time position was created for a University Art Collection & Gallery Coordinator/ Curator. This position included the management of the collection.

In 2005 the VC Paul Clark approved a recurrent budget of \$10,000 from VC Strategic Funds for the acquisition of new work each year.

Between 2005 & 2008 a lot of work was done on pulling the collection into order. The SCU Art Collection Committee was put in place to oversee all decisions regarding the collection including any purchases and or donation made to or on behalf of the University. A collection Policy was approved. The gallery was endorsed as an ATO cultural gift recipient.

The collection has been catalogued, missing works identified and formal loan agreements for the work put into place. In 2007 a valuation was undertaken of 31 selected works from the collection that returned and estimated value of \$108,000. ¹³ In 2010 a display policy was put in place and in November 2010 a site audit of all work out on loan was conducted. Through this audit three missing works were discovered.

The collection is now catalogued into three collection areas being: The Permanent Collection, Alumni Collection and the Special Collection which is essentially made up of official SCU portraits and other works that do not fit within the criteria of the permanent collection.

Of the six official portraits **Peter Churcher's** portrait of Barry Conyngham is widely regarded as the most significant in terms of it's value and artistic merit. It is hoped that this area of the collection can be developed in line with the University Collection Policy in the future in such a way as to add value to the collection.

2005 – 2010 Purchases during this period include: three prints by **Judy Watson** through Graham Galleries + Editions, Brisbane. In 2007 **Makinti Napanangka** and **Yukultji Napangati** were acquired from Pupunya Tula Artists Pty Ltd. In 2008 the university acquired a **Euan McLeod** from Watters Gallery. 2009 acquisitions included **Christine Willcocks** and **Tony Nankervis**. The most recent acquisitions for 2010 are **Karla Dickens** and **Samuel Topou**.

The university was fortunate to be able to acquire the Napanangka and Napangati paintings for substantially less than the average gallery prices at the time. These two works were sourced by a SCU visual arts graduate who was working as a field officer with the Papunya Tula artists and they rank high amongst the jewels in the crown of the Southern Cross University Art Collection.

Thanks must go to all those people who have, over the years, cared for and at times actively guarded the collection and to all those people who have, through their commitment and belief in the value of a university collection, added to it in whatever way they could over the last 39 years.





This stoneware vase was multiple fired (up to 5 times) to over cone 10 in a wood fired kiln. Each firing extends over 5 days - so the work has been fired for 25 days in total. After each firing another glaze is applied to the piece to build visual depth through layering of surface. The colour variations on the surface are generated by fire flashing and ash deposition.





Notes: Yukultji Napangati arrived at Kiwirrkura, WA in 1984. Prior to this she had been living with eight members of her immediate family in an area of country to the west of Wilkinkarra (Lake Mackay). The group had remained in the Great Sandy Desert long after all other Pintupi families had moved to the government settlements of Ikuntji (Haasts Bluff), Papunya and Wirrimanu (Balgo). It was estimated that at the time she came in she was 14 years old.


