

Critical risk

Violence and aggression





Cause #	Cause description
1	An individual (experiencing mental ill-health, under the influence, armed, previous student or employee, member of public with intent to harm) attacks an SCU employee or student.
2	An armed individual (member of the public, previous employee or student) with specific intent to cause fatal harm enters a SCU campus and attacks.
3	A SCU employee or student, working remote and isolated is threatened or attacked with potential to cause fatal harm.
4	Students attend a placements in industries or in a remote community with an increased likelihood of violence and aggression.
5	A SCU employee is working from home and is threatened or attacked by a domestic violence perpetrator with potential to cause fatal harm.
6	An individual or group physically attack SCU employees during emergency evacuation with Lismore campus as the e-vac center.
7	A SCU employee or student weaponises items on campus (e.g. kitchen knives, maintenance tools) and attacks with potential to be fatal.
8	A SCU employee or student is physically attacked in a road rage incident with potential to cause fatal harm.

(CC01) Duress alarms: Installed and accessible at critical locations.	Critical	1, 2, 6, 7
(CC02) High-risk persons database: A potential high-risk persons is established and maintained and action is taken per the database recommendations.	Critical	1 – 7
(CCO3) Building security assessments: There are three-yearly security assessments completed for SCU campus and sites, followed on by installation and maintenance of security equipment based on those assessments.	Critical	1, 2, 7
(CC04) Campus access control: There is controlled access of to SCU campus buildings and controlled sites.	Critical	1, 2, 6, 7
(CC05) SCU Employee Pairing: There is a defined process to ensure a minimum of two SCU employees are present when interacting with people identified as high risk people (potential for occupational violent behaviour) or attending a location where high risk people may be present or is remote and isolated. Employee and student 'campus safety' awareness training.	Non-Critical	1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8
Regular, visible campus security patrols.	Non-Critical	1, 2, 3, 6, 7
Building design review to consider ample lighting, forward-facing doors with swipe card access only, and other security measures.	Non-Critical	1, 2, 3, 6, 7
Weekend campus work security protocol (check in and out with security).	Non-Critical	1, 2, 3
Oversight of tenants security policies.	Non-Critical	1,2,3
Employee de-escalation training.	Non-Critical	1 – 8
