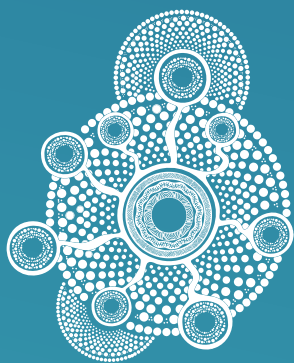

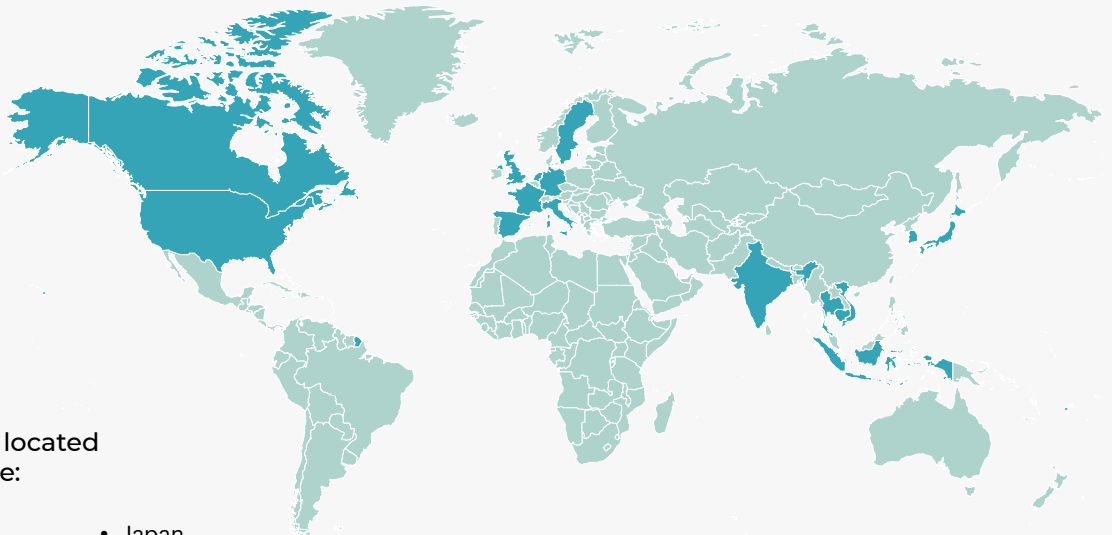

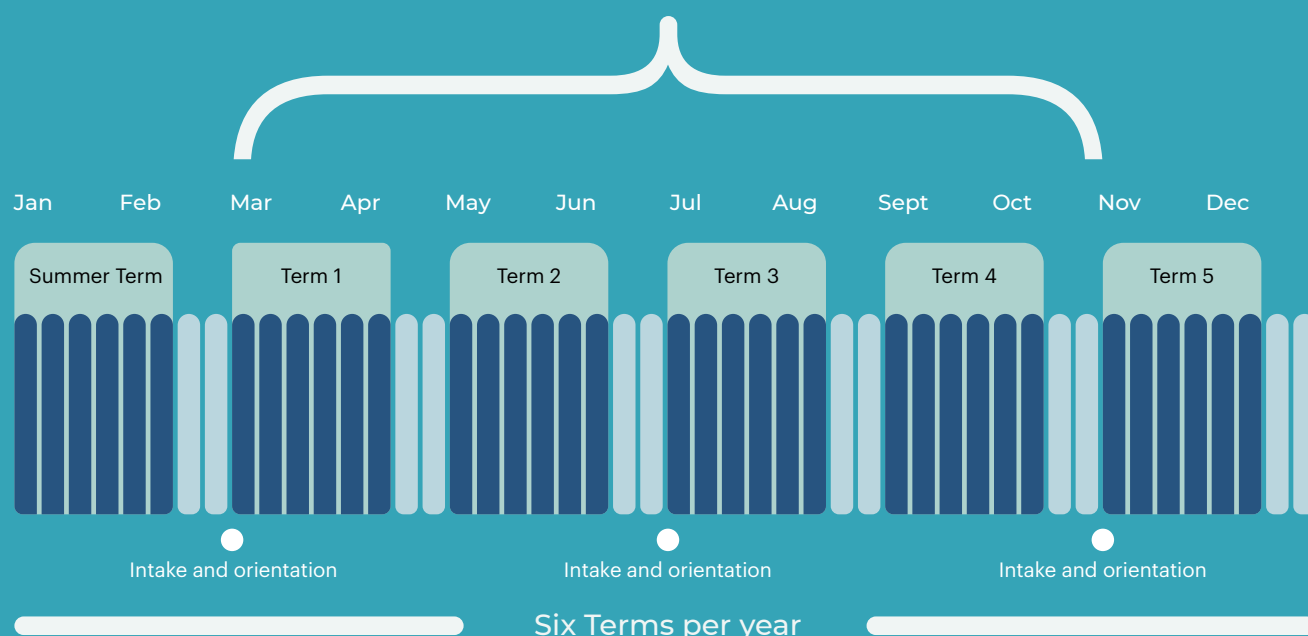

Tuition fees and study costs

Commonwealth Supported Places

Tuition fees for most undergraduate and some postgraduate degrees are subsidised by the Australian Government. These are called Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP). You pay a part of the tuition fees and the Government pays the rest.

You can defer the payment of your fees for a CSP degree through the HECS-HELP loan scheme. This allows you to postpone paying your fees until your income reaches a certain threshold. You then pay it back a little at a time through the tax system.

Student Services and Amenities Fee

Also known as SSAF, the Student Services and Amenities Fee is used to provide important services and amenities to students both on and off campus. Your course is made up of units and the SSAF is calculated per unit. The maximum SSAF fee in 2026 was \$373. Eligible students have the option of deferring this fee through the SA-HELP loan scheme.

Other study costs

Your costs could also include computer equipment and software, stationery, field trips, uniforms, vaccinations or other course-specific expenses such as travel for practicums, internships or industry experience.

Books and supplies

Some courses will require you to buy textbooks. The cost of textbooks varies greatly from unit-to-unit. Second-hand textbooks are sometimes available.

In other courses, you may not have to buy textbooks. Check out our 'Zero Textbook Cost' initiative and see if your course is listed there.

Featured scholarships

Vice-Chancellor Scholarships \$50,000

Commencing enrolled students with an ATAR of 95 and above are eligible for one of ten \$50,000 scholarships. This award recognises ongoing high academic achievement.

Resilience Merit Scholarships \$36,000

For high achieving students overcoming financial or educational barriers, there are fifteen \$36,000 scholarships available.

Vice-Chancellor Regional Leadership Scholarships \$50,000

For students from one of the local schools near our Gold Coast, Northern Rivers or Coffs Harbour campuses with an ATAR of 90 and above, there are ten \$50,000 scholarships available.

Vice-Chancellor's Indigenous Excellence Scholarships \$24,000

For high achieving Indigenous Australian students there are ten \$24,000 scholarships available.

Southern Cross University Merit Scholarships \$36,000

For students from one of the local schools near our Gold Coast, Northern Rivers or Coffs Harbour campuses with an ATAR of 80 and above, there are fifteen \$36,000 scholarships available.

SCU College

Our preparation programs and Diplomas will set you on the road to success. Whether you are uncertain about if you meet university entry requirements, looking to build your academic skills for university or interested in an alternative entry to study, we have the right pathway for you.

Preparation programs

Which best describes you?

I am over 18 and looking to gain entry into university.

Preparing for Success Program

The Preparing for Success Program (PSP) is a free 12-week full-time or yearly part-time pathway program, delivered on-campus or online. PSP will help you develop the study skills necessary for success at university. Once you have completed the PSP through SCU College, you can move straight on to your Southern Cross University degree knowing that you are well-prepared for further study. This course is open to Australian residents over the age of 18.

I am graduating high school this year and want to lock in a spot at university.

Transition to Uni

Want to study at university but worried you might not get the ATAR you need? Our six-week Transition to Uni (TU) program helps build your academic skills to prepare you for university. Study TU online, full-time in January-February and gain entry to most Southern Cross University degrees from March onwards. This free course is open to Australian residents who have just finished Year 12 and have an ATAR or are ATAR-eligible.

Diplomas

If you do not have a suitable qualification for direct entry into a specialist degree program, or if you want to study university one step at a time, talk to our team about finding the perfect Diploma for you. SCU College has a variety of Diplomas that provide direct entry into the second year of a range of Bachelor courses, with students able to receive up to full advanced standing.

By completing a Diploma you can also get a qualification while you study, which can help secure a job in your discipline while completing further study.

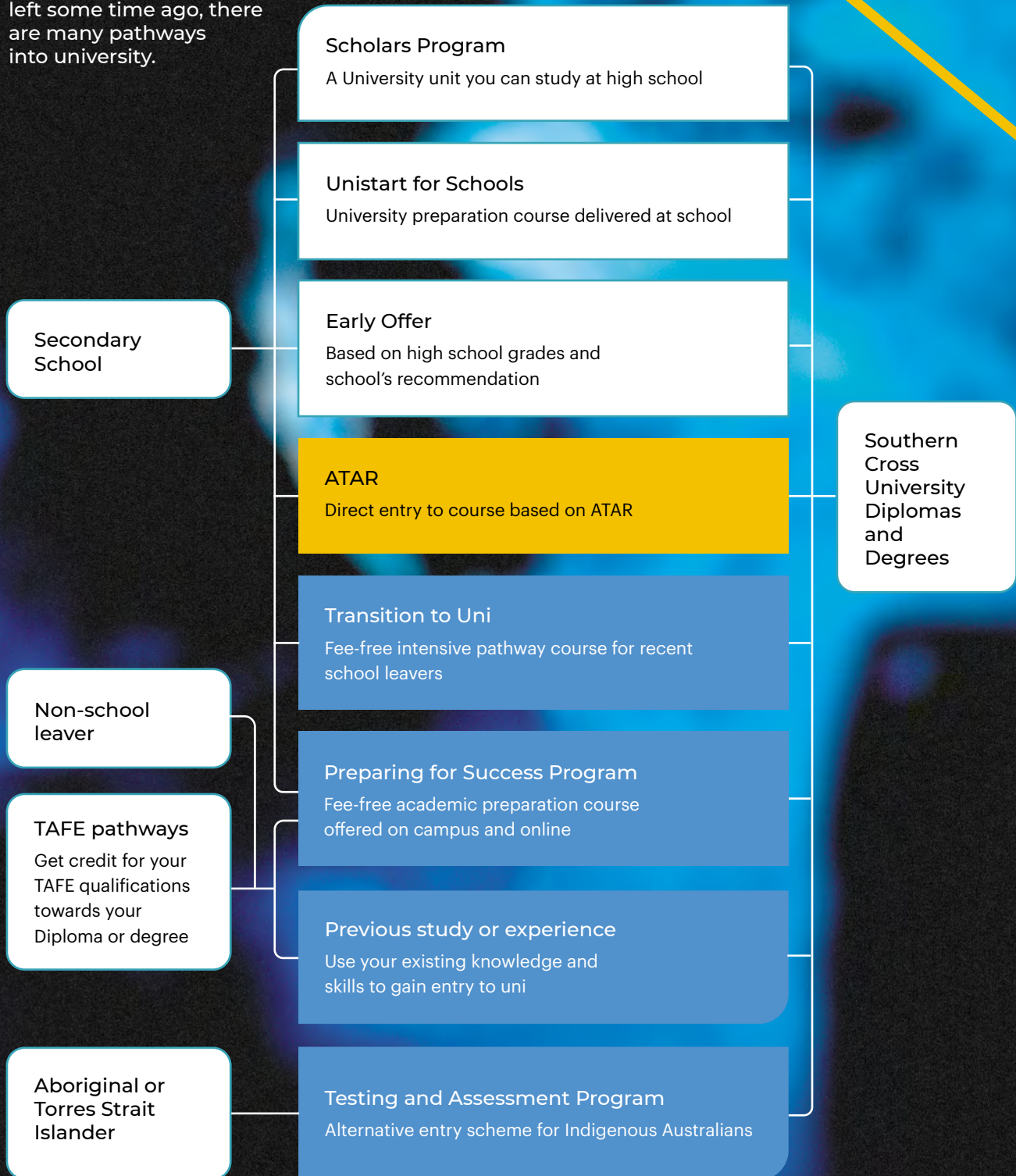

Southern Cross University has over 300 formal credit agreements with TAFE institutes and other Registered Training Organisations (RTOs). These arrangements span major study areas including health, science, engineering, education, business, law and specialist fields like tourism and hospitality.

3. Start your degree with a clear pathway.

If you've completed an approved TAFE qualification in NSW or Queensland, Southern Cross offers cross-border pathways into selected undergraduate degrees, helping you progress to university sooner and study close to where you live and work.

Our Bachelor of Business (Accounting) is a structured progression of core subjects covering accounting, finance, economics, sustainability, law, artificial intelligence, business analytics, and professional development. The course develops your skills as a well-rounded business professional with experience across a diverse panorama of roles and organisations.

The Accounting specialisation develops knowledge and skills in taxation, financial reporting, financial and management accounting, auditing, and business finance, and is CPA Australia, Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand, and Tax Practitioner's Board (TPB) accredited.

The Bachelor of Education is a gateway degree to work as a registered teacher in Australia. It also qualifies graduates to work in many countries overseas.

This cutting-edge, evidence-based course draws on the University’s leadership and research in teacher education. A distinctive suite of first year units provides excellent grounding in literacy, numeracy, science, and core subject content. All students undertake studies in Indigenous education, sustainability, inclusive education, classroom management, brain and learning, and other contemporary curriculum areas.

Specialisations

All students choose a single or combined specialisation from the following:

Early Childhood/Primary

For teaching in both early childhood settings and primary schools.

Primary

For teaching in primary schools from kindergarten/prep to Year 6. Includes an approved compulsory English Primary Specialisation with opportunities for an approved NESA Specialisation in Mathematics or Science and Technology.

Primary/Secondary

For teaching in both primary schools and in one subject in secondary schools. This course includes an AITSL English Primary Specialisation and one secondary teaching subject chosen from English, Mathematics, Geography or Modern History.

Secondary

For teaching in secondary schools. Career opportunities

Depending on the specialisation chosen, graduates may work in early childhood settings, primary or secondary schools, developing as leaders and/or specialists within educational settings. Combined specialisations in early childhood/primary and primary/secondary allow for teaching across a wide range of age groups.

Increasing the number of students in initial teacher education programs has been identified by the Australian Government as a priority to help address the national teacher workforce crisis.

More than 80 per cent of our education graduates are employed full-time within four months of completing their course (Good Universities Guide 2026).

Engaging young minds

Encouraging curiosity and learning is a driving force for Bachelor of Education student Kelsey Tonna.

Kelsey was already working as an Education Leader in an early childhood centre when she decided to expand her career prospects and become an early childhood teacher.

"I love that young children are so curious and open to learning," Kelsey said.

"They love having a conversation with you. They are learning new things so their minds are open and they are intrigued and engaged. I just love teaching them."

Kelsey completed her first placement at Little Seeds in Tugun, Queensland, where she developed the skills to create and implement a program in a classroom.

"I was in the kinder room and the first two weeks I was guided on how to run a program and incorporate different topics. By the last three to four weeks I was given free reign to lead my own program," she said.

Flexible, online study and strong student support have been pillars in Kelsey's university education.

"I like that I can email my lecturers about anything and they are always so helpful. If I need advice, they will get back to me straight away.



"I like that I can log in whenever it suits me. If I'm working and miss a tutorial or workshop, I can go back and re-watch it. The six-week terms have also been great and make you feel like you are progressing through your course quickly."

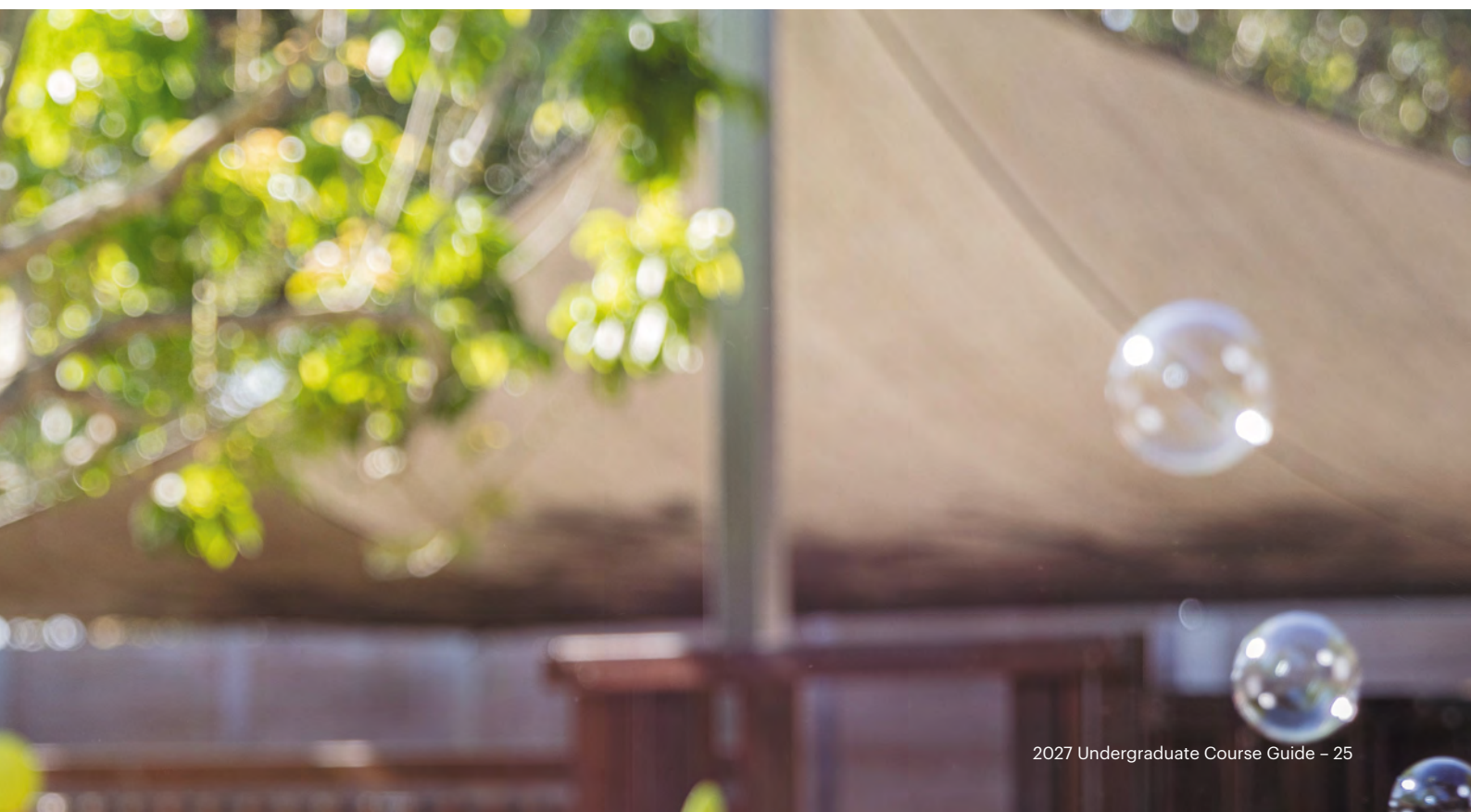

The Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) meets the requirements for accreditation at the level of Professional Engineer by Engineers Australia. Foundational core units build knowledge of the basic sciences, and the processes and philosophy that underpin the engineering profession.

You will then choose a specialisation of either civil or mechanical engineering and build discipline knowledge and technical skills with a strong emphasis on project-based learning.

The final year of the course contains advanced discipline-specific research and design units that build skills in independent investigation, critical thinking, creative problem-solving, and ethical and professional behaviour.

Specialisations

Civil Engineering

Students develop skills and knowledge across the breadth of disciplines encompassed by civil engineering, including construction, project management, hydraulic engineering, water and wastewater engineering, structural, geotechnical engineering and transport engineering.

Mechanical Engineering

Students develop skills and knowledge in three main areas that cover all aspects of mechanical engineering. These include mechanical design and manufacturing systems, thermo-fluid mechanics and energy

systems, and mechatronics and control systems.

Career opportunities

Building a better world for all

Picture this: Alarms are sounding. Smoke fills the air. You rush to the fire exit—but the door won't open. Every second counts. What do you do?

In an emergency, evacuation routes are meant to save lives. Yet for people using electric wheelchairs, some fire doors can be extremely difficult to open, creating dangerous delays and barriers to safety. When engineering student Brigid Richardson recognised this issue, she decided to take action.

"I chose to study engineering because I am passionate about universal design," Brigid said. "There are many accessibility issues at present that must be fixed."

Brigid's Honours research focuses on accessibility in fire evacuation. Her work examines how long it takes a person using an electric wheelchair to open a fire door and move through the door, depending on how heavy the opening force of the door is.

Currently studying a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) at Southern Cross University's Lismore campus, Brigid is building practical, hands-on skills that she is already applying in the workplace.

"We have on-campus residentials where we do tensile stress tests for concrete, steel and all different materials. We then do 60 days of work-integrated learning where we get experience working in industry," she said.

As part of her studies, Brigid completed a ground service accessibility program for the campus and completed work experience at Lismore City Council, where she now works as an Assets Engineer and GIS Analyst.

"I look at information for assets from roads to stormwater system, including maintenance and the spatial degree."

Brigid is also the President of the SCU Student Engineering Society, a role that has helped her build strong industry connections and leadership skills.

"We organised for engineering professionals to come in, talk to students, and give them an understanding of employment opportunities and what they are looking for in a candidate."

Looking ahead, Brigid hopes to continue working in the field of fire evacuation accessibility.

"It's a topic that is not explored enough. We need people with firsthand experience and the technical knowledge to give input and make improvements for all."

Together with foundational sciences, you will explore the intricacies of human health and examine the pathological basis of disease processes by studying human pathophysiology, molecular genetics, immunology and pharmacology.

This course has a strong mathematical component and is taught in laboratories equipped with cutting-edge analytical equipment. It provides a solid base in biomedical science, from anatomy, immunology, neuroscience and microbiology to haematology and more. A substantial professional placement builds invaluable on-the-job experience.

Career opportunities

Graduates with a biomedical science degree can pursue careers in various fields, including biomedical and health research, university and government research, and hospital, veterinary, and pathology laboratories (in laboratory assistant or technician roles). “I’ve been to a variety of different places for work experience placements, including allied health clinics, over 50s gyms and the on-campus health clinic. It’s been really good because there’s been such a vast array of opportunities for me and I get to see the whole spectrum of what I’m capable of doing.”



From patient to practitioner

Scott Painter is combining personal experience and clinical knowledge to empower people with brain injuries to pursue their passions.

After suffering a brain injury and multiple strokes at the age of 17, resulting in a year-long hospital stint, Scott had to relearn how to do everything.

“Some of the staff there were great, but I did have some health professionals say to me: ‘I’ve seen heaps of people like you – you’ll never eat again, or walk again’, and that’s not exactly something a 17-year-old wants to hear when they’re so early in life,” said Scott.

Now in his thirties, not only did Scott make a full recovery, he works as the Practice Manager and Head Accredited Exercise Physiologist at Headway ABI Australia on the Gold Coast. He specialises in Neurological Physical Rehabilitation, helping others overcome the devastating effects of acquired brain injuries.

After completing Southern Cross University’s Preparing for Success Program, a fee-free pathway course, Scott decided to study clinical exercise physiology.

“Southern Cross was incredible in the support they provided. Their disability support is what helped get me through. The lecturers were so accommodating. I would record my lectures on a dictaphone, and when I was doing my recovery – my therapies and rehab at home – I would listen to the lectures, so I was studying and doing my recovery at the same time,” he said.

“The support I received from Southern Cross was incredible, second-to-none. I don’t think I could’ve gone anywhere else.

“My past medical history means I have that dual perspective of being a patient and now being a practitioner, so having that knowledge of what it is they might be going through, it does make me quite a rare practitioner. Demonstrating genuine care is essential as patients are more receptive to your knowledge when they feel personally supported.”

The Bachelor of Clinical Sciences (Osteopathic Studies) has a strong clinical focus and provides you with a comprehensive grounding in biomedical science and health. During the course, you will gain the knowledge and skills required to continue postgraduate study in osteopathic medicine, which is required for registration as an osteopath. Core units include the study of advanced levels of anatomy and physiology, particularly the structure and function of the muscular and nervous systems.

Career opportunities

Osteopaths work in private practice. To become a registered osteopath, you need to successfully complete both the Bachelor of Clinical Sciences (Osteopathic Studies) and Southern Cross University's Master of Osteopathic Medicine.

Total full-time duration of both courses is 4.5 years.

Osteopathy

Osteopathy is a hands-on manual therapy that restores movement and function through a combination of massage, joint movement, stretches, gentle joint manipulation and exercise.

In Australia, osteopaths are government-registered allied health practitioners who complete university training in anatomy, physiology, pathology, general healthcare diagnosis, and osteopathic techniques. Osteopaths can provide all-round osteopathic care, as well as concentrating on specific areas of practice, such as exercise-based rehabilitation, pain management, paediatric and sports medicine.

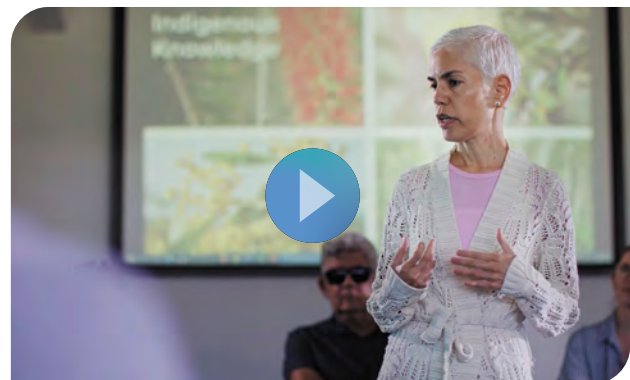

When Wiradyuri woman Carol De Launey crossed Southern Cross University's graduation stage in 2002, she did not know she would be trailblazing a path for generations of her family over the next two decades.

Carol graduated with a Doctor of Philosophy, followed by her daughter Tanietta De Launey, who graduated in 2012, and her granddaughter Keyarra Sweetwater-Delauney, who crossed the stage in 2025.

Keyarra entered university through the Preparing for Success Program, a pathway program that develops academic skills, before enrolling in the Bachelor of Indigenous Knowledge. During her studies, she received the support of the Indigenous Tutorial Assistance Scheme (ITAS), and passed with flying colours.

"This has been the most challenging and transformative journey of my life," she says.

"University was so much more than I expected. Throughout the course I had so many meaningful experiences with Elders, Indigenous academics and with cultural events at Gnibi. It was a special time in my life that I will never forget.

Keyarra is currently employed with the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service as a Joint Management

Coordinator, working with Native Title holders across the Northern NSW Branch of NPWS. "My role involves acting as a key link between NPWS and local Aboriginal communities to support and implement joint management of national parks. I am extremely proud to be working in this space and to be able to meaningfully apply the knowledge and skills I gained through my undergraduate degree."

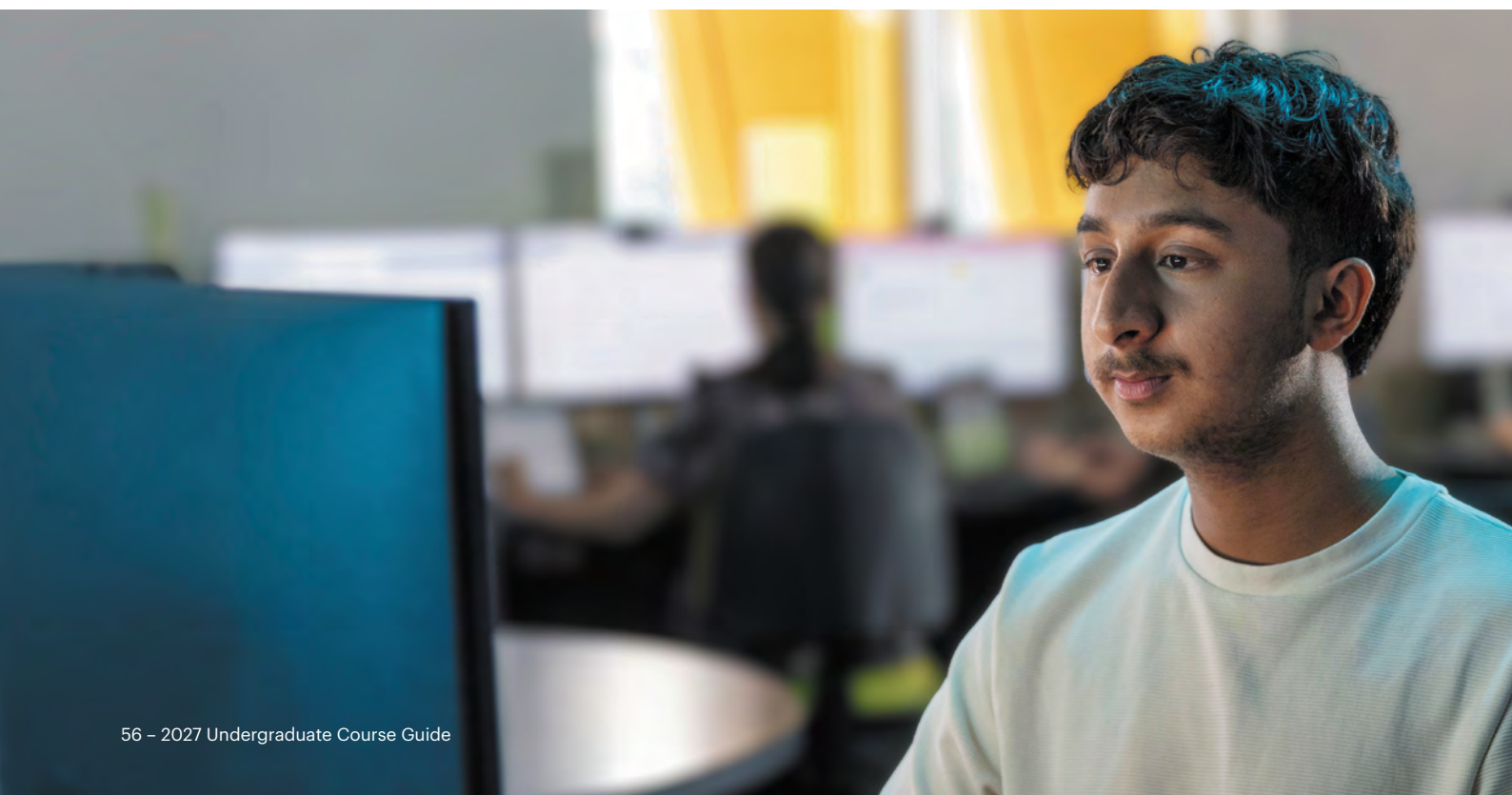

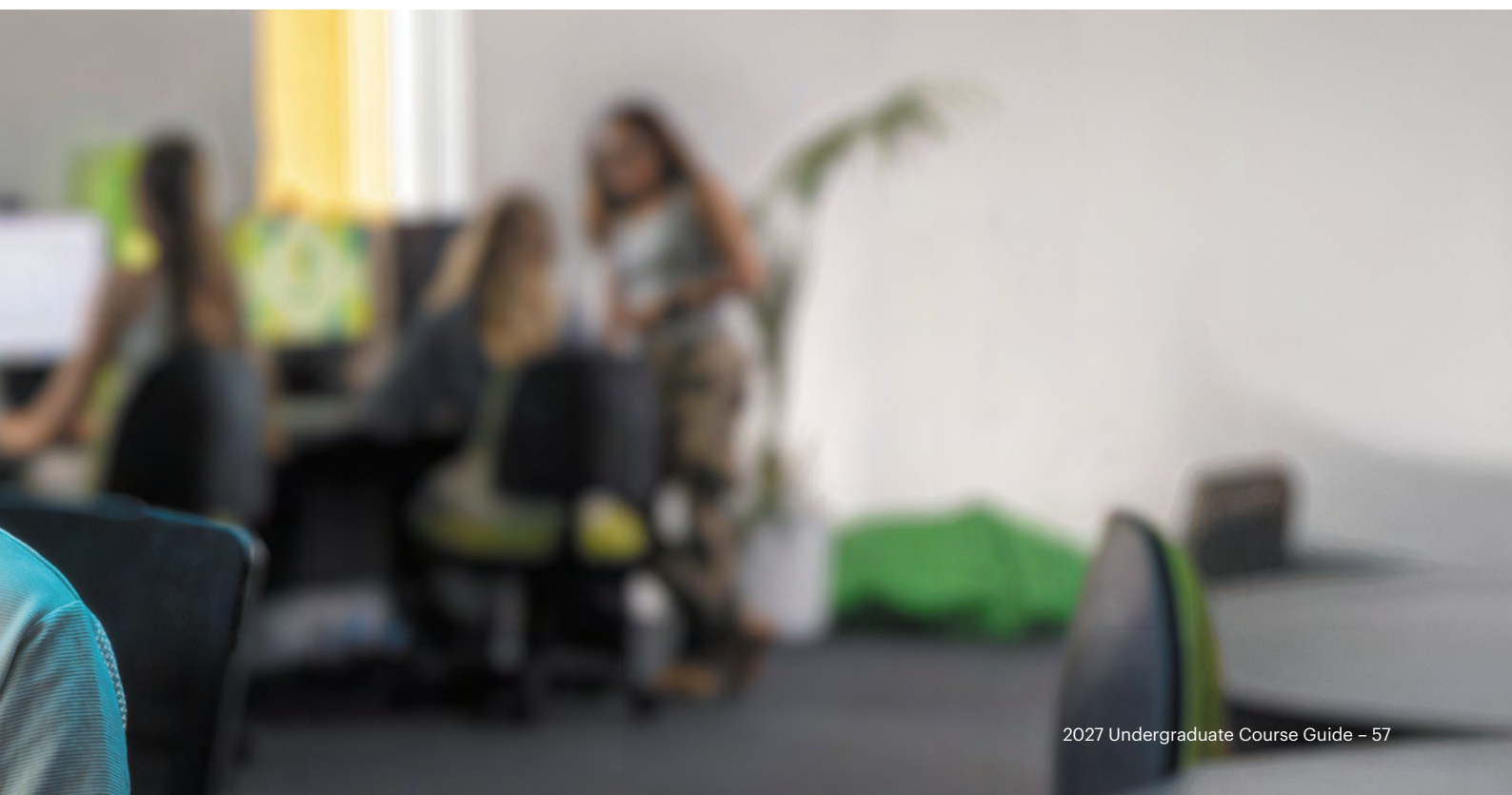

Upon completion of her degree, Emily landed a prestigious role in the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) graduate program.

Graduating from the program early, Emily was posted to the Australian Embassy in Serbia where she worked as Third Secretary for five months, assisting in consular and passport matters. Emily assisted with advising on complex consular cases, performing notarial work for clients and administrative tasks in the Embassy.

From there, Emily worked as a Policy Officer for Thailand and Laos in DFAT's Office of Southeast Asia before being posted to her current position as Vice Consul at the Australian Consulate in Noumea, New Caledonia.

Triple graduate, triple impact: Cooper is working for bees, people and the environment

In 2014, during his undergraduate Environmental Science degree, Dr Cooper Schouten received a New Colombo Plan scholarship, funded by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, to work in rural Timor-Leste. He began to recognise the state of the environment as inextricably linked to community welfare, and how his love of bees could be used to help both the environment and people.

After completing his Bachelor of Science with first class honours at Southern Cross and working with honey hunting communities across Indonesia, Cooper went on to do a PhD looking at the reasons why international aid and agricultural interventions work, and also why they don't.

"A lot of the time organisations seeking to help poor people can have the best intentions, but the outcomes for rural farmers aren't always successful," he said. "I wanted to change that."

In addition to the many agricultural research and development projects he now leads, Cooper is also the Director of the Southern Cross University Bee Research and Extension Lab. Here he is leading the charge to find more efficient and sustainable ways to control invasive bee pests like Varroa mite, as well as developing new knowledge and practices for beekeepers and pollination-dependant horticultural industries.

National Marine Science Centre

The National Marine Science Centre (NMSC) is part of Southern Cross University's Faculty of Science and Engineering.

Located at Charlesworth Bay in Coffs Harbour, the NMSC sits on the edge of the beautiful Solitary Islands Marine Park. The Solitary Islands have a unique range of tropical and temperate habitats, making a perfect environment for marine research and education programs. Vets play a critical role in our communities and economy. There is a chronic shortage of vets and veterinary technologists in Australia, particularly in rural and regional areas.

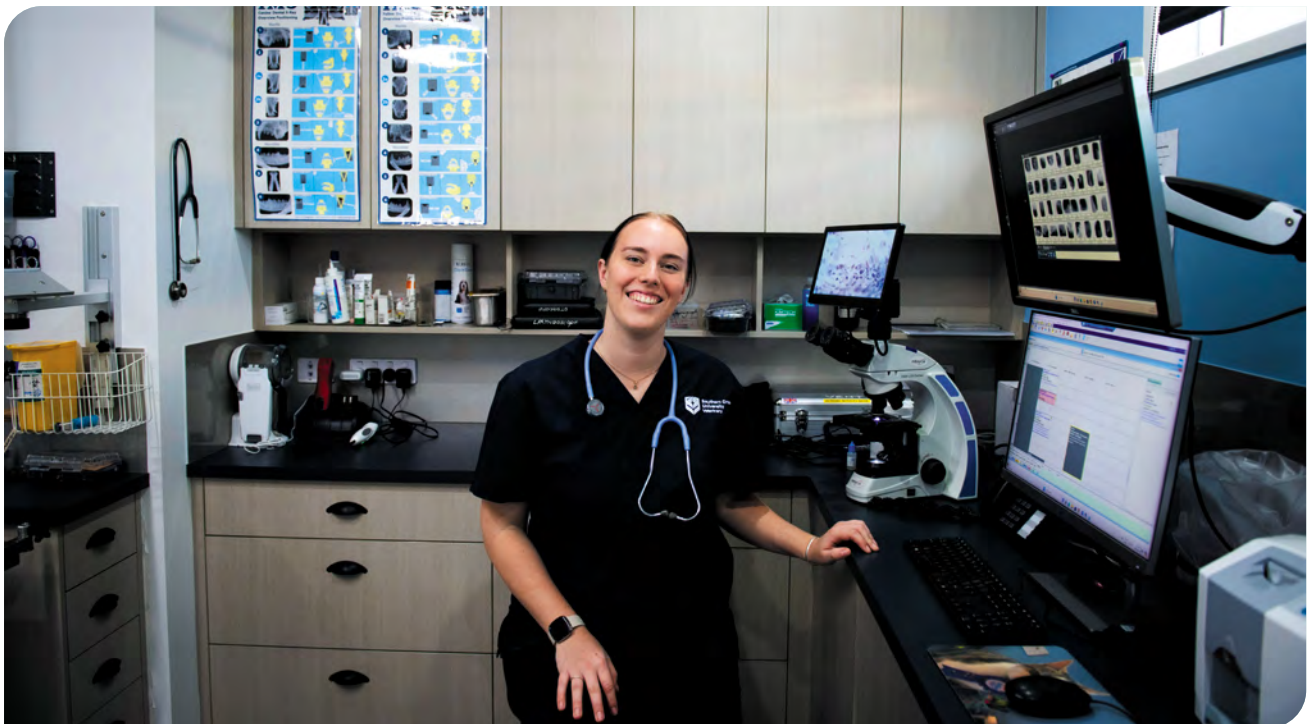
