Unit description

This double weighted unit provides skills to help ensure work-readiness and assist in future employability based on an extended work-placement in industry, government, non-government organisations or academia. The unit requires the application of expert skills knowledge within a professional working environment for career development and experience.

Content

A portfolio should include evidence to support one of the following:

- 1) An extended industry placement including for example:
 - a. completion of a workplace induction
 - b. work contract or timesheets
 - c. reference/performance review from workplace supervisor indicating satisfactory performance at the expected level for a University Graduate
 - d. examples of tasks performed or written reports
 - e. any other evidence supporting transferable skills in the workplace.

OR:

- 2) An academic teaching contract for role as a unit assessor:
 - a. online supervisor training
 - b. unit information guide
 - c. lecture slides, tutorial notes and/or practical manual
 - d. assessment matrix or other evidence for managing student assessment
 - e. candidate evaluations indicating satisfaction with the unit and teaching performance
